Welcome Back

The FDCC is thrilled to welcome our members and their families back to The Greenbrier Resort. A favorite of so many and soon to become a favorite of our “newbies,” The Greenbrier was chosen not only for its reputation and amenities, but for the health and safety of our attendees. Almost all of the activities offered during the FDCC program will take place on the grounds of The Greenbrier. While we may employ some socially distanced shuttles (owned and serviced by The Greenbrier), we will be avoiding the big coach buses we have utilized in the past. The Greenbrier has instituted all necessary protocols as recommended by the CDC for COVID-19 and we will be staying in touch with the resort as we move closer to the event. As of this writing, temperature checks are required as are masks for all hotel guests and their staff. Housekeeping protocols have been updated and little adjustments such as limiting the number of people in each elevator (1 person or 1 family unit!) have been instituted. Your Convention Team will be continually monitoring the protocols necessary to ensure that our attendees feel safe.

WELCOME BACK ...

The last time we were together – really together, in-person – was in early March of 2020 at the foot of Camelback Mountain in Scottsdale, Arizona. That seems like a million years ago. If we knew then what we know now, would we have rushed to get back to our offices or, instead, chosen to savor each and every minute together?

To say that the past year has been a challenge is an understatement. But there is light at the end of the tunnel! Vaccines are being administered, Covid infections are decreasing and we have planned what we hope will be a grand reunion at the beautiful Greenbrier resort in White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia, from Sunday, August 1 through Saturday, August 7.

The FDCC was last at the resort in 2014. And, while The Greenbrier – “America’s Resort” – remains timeless and elegant (channeling the renowned decorator, Dorothy Draper), it is not your grandmother’s Greenbrier. Like the Federation, the resort continues to evolve, maintaining the best of the past and embracing the innovations of the present.

Located on 11,000 acres, The Greenbrier features indoor and outdoor pools, a spa, bowling alley and movie theater, a casino on property, tennis courts and a fitness center. It also has a world class golf course, skeet and clay shooting at the gun club, fly fishing opportunities galore and, for those who are more adventurous, driving experiences, aerial and rope courses and day-long zip line adventures. These are just the tip of the iceberg. The resort also offers escape rooms, scavenger hunts (using your smart phones), bubble soccer, stand up paddle boards, horseback riding and the infamous Bunker Tour. For the foodies in the group, we will be offering a charcuterie class complete with your own Greenbrier cutting board to take home. And, although the dress code is still upscale (jacket and tie in the Main Dining Room for dinner, jacket in Prime 44 West and after 7:00 in the casino), many will be pleased to know that “well-kept” dark denim is now permitted almost everywhere.

While Covid restrictions will make this a meeting unlike any other, there will still be plenty of opportunities for

celebration, fellowship and networking. **Monday** will be a low key day where you can explore the resort, take part in day-long, off-resort activities if you choose or simply reconnect with old friends and new around the pool. Casey Stansbury’s program – “Shoot for the Stars!” – will kick off on **Tuesday** followed by the New Member Orientation and a beautiful President’s Reception under the stars. On **Wednesday** we will have our “Family Reunion” Theme Party at Kate’s Mountain Lodge, a venue with beautiful mountain views, perfect for star gazing. We will switch the schedule up this year and have our Dine Around on **Thursday** evening followed by the Dessert Party. The Dine Around will feature on-site restaurants but if you want to travel to nearby Lewisburg, we have included a list of restaurants you may want to try. **Friday** we will have a Gala befitting of the 85th anniversary of the FDCC. This will be a black tie optional event. Think of it as a great opportunity to shed those lounge clothes you’ve been wearing for the past 18 months for some tonier threads.

The program will be structured like no other FDCC program. Section Meetings will take place on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings and will address cutting edge legal issues. The Plenary sessions will consist of two power-packed hours each day. The first hour will be star presentations by our very own FDCC members. The second hour will be our daily keynote speakers: Nicole Stott, a U.S. Astronaut; Captain Richard Phillips, whose experience when his cargo ship was hijacked by Somali pirates was made famous by Tom Hanks’ portrayal in the movie “Captain Phillips”; and acclaimed singer, songwriter Steven Page, formerly of the Barenaked Ladies. Mr. Page will also treat us to a “welcome back” surprise at the end of his presentation. So start warming up your singing voices and get ready to reach for the stars!

RESERVATIONS

Located amid the breathtaking mountains of West Virginia, The Greenbrier is a National Historic Landmark and world class resort. The natural mineral springs of White Sulphur Springs were the original lure of the resort and continue to draw guests to the luxury retreat today. With a guest list that includes 27 of our country's 45 Presidents, America's Resort has long been a favorite destination of royalty, celebrities, and business leaders. Today, The Greenbrier invites a new generation to come out and play. Enjoy relaxing pastimes, start treasured traditions, or set out on an amazing adventure with your family and friends.

Those adventures can include everything from the off-road driving course, activities at the onsite gun club, horseback riding, fly fishing to cooking classes and tours of "The Bunker." Almost all of the activities are located on The Greenbrier property, allowing you more time to enjoy the activity instead of a long bus ride!

The FDCC has negotiated a room rate that is a "family friendly" \$289 for a "run of house (ROH)" room... which is \$10 less than our room rate in 2014! We have a dedicated reservations link that can be found on the FDCC website, as

well as an FDCC Reservations Call-in number: 855-702-2402. If you have questions about accommodations or need something "special," the Reservations Agents at The Greenbrier are ready to assist. While room types are not guaranteed for our ROH rooms, you may be interested in their selection of suites or cottages for an additional charge. All rates are subject to applicable state and local taxes in effect at the time of check-in. The FDCC also has negotiated the resort fee down to \$20 (from \$39) per room per night. That fee includes morning coffee service, afternoon tea, nightly movies in the theater, resort-wide wireless internet, on-property transportation, and much more. There is also a 6.5% Historical Preservation Fund assessment (per room, per day).

As of publication, the FDCC room block at The Greenbrier is sold out. There may be rooms available outside of the FDCC room block (at higher rates) and those may be reserved through the Reservations telephone number: 855-702-2402. There are also accommodations in Lewisburg, WV, which is approximately 15 minutes from The Greenbrier. For a list of those properties, please visit the FDCC website and click on the Annual Meeting link.

Check-in time is 4:00 pm and check-out is 11:00 am. In the event you arrive early or need to depart later, the valet will be happy to check your luggage at the hotel bell stand.



GETTING THERE

The Greenbrier is an easy drive from many locations on the East Coast. The resort is conveniently located off Interstate 64 just west of the Virginia/West Virginia border. Non-stop flights to nearby Greenbrier Valley Airport (LWB) are available from Chicago O'Hare (ORD) and Washington Dulles (IAD). If you choose to fly into Roanoke, VA (ROA) there are many car rental agencies at the airport. It is a 90-minute drive to The Greenbrier. There is also Business Class rail service from Washington, DC to White Sulphur Springs (WSS) with the train stop located across the road from the resort!

The Greenbrier Transportation Department will be happy to assist you with shuttle transportation from any of the area airports. Please call (855)453-4858 for information or check the FDCC website for details.

DRESS CODE

The hotel itself has more than 200 years of history to share. The Greenbrier prides itself on tradition and honoring the experience, style and hospitality that has made it "America's Resort." To that end, The Greenbrier appreciates their guests support of their Dress Code. Jackets and ties are required for men in the Main Dining Room for dinner. The Casino Club requires jackets (not

ties) after 7:00 pm and jackets are suggested for Prime 44 West and the Lobby Bar. Denim is permitted throughout the resort during the day. Please check the FDCC website for a "venue by venue" list of suggested attire for the resort.

Recommended attire for the FDCC Activities will be noted in the brochure descriptions.

We anticipate the weather for the FDCC Annual Meeting to be perfect! But, for planning purposes...

Early August temperatures tend to be in the low 80's during the day and a comfortable 55-60 degrees in the evenings for our outdoor events.

MEETING REGISTRATION

CANCELLATION POLICIES

HOTEL CANCELLATIONS

All reservations are guaranteed with a deposit of the first night's reservation fee. Hotel cancellations received less than 14 days before arrival will forfeit the one-night deposit. The FDCC has no authority to modify the hotel's cancellation and refund policies.

CONVENTION REGISTRATION CANCELLATION DEADLINE

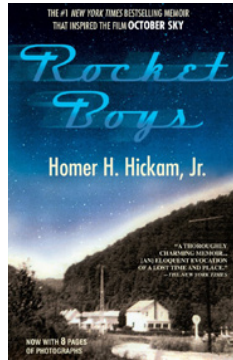
We realize that unforeseen emergencies and trial schedules may require cancellation. Please note the FDCC Board approved refund policy: A refund of registration fees, less \$85 and the applicable credit card fees charged to FDCC by the bank, will be given if the FDCC office receives written request of cancellation on or before July 1, 2021. After this date, no refunds will be given. In the event of special circumstances, such as illness or unforeseen family or professional emergencies, this refund policy may be suspended or modified, only by action of the President upon recommendation of the Convention Chair. It is recommended that all registrants get trip cancellation insurance. Fees paid for FDCC tours/activities are based on the tour operator's policies. The decision to refund those fees will be based on written notice of cancellation and the tour operator's refund policies.

CHILDREN & YOUTH ACTIVITIES

We've got you covered, from morning childcare during the Section and Plenary Meetings to the evening activities. The FDCC has negotiated a special daily low rate of \$55/child from 7:30 am – 12:00 pm in The Greenbrier Adventure Zone. Advance registration is recommended and must be done by 6:00 pm the day prior and is based on availability. Call 855-453-4858 and let them know you are with the FDCC.

Children must be 3 years old and fully potty trained to enroll in the Adventure Zone program. No pull-ups or diapers are permitted.

The FDCC will have special, age appropriate programming for children during the Presidential Reception and the FDCC Final Dinner & Gala events. Pre-registration for those events is required and children must also be at least 3 years old and fully potty trained.

BABYSITTING

If your child does not meet the eligibility requirements for the Adventure Zone, or you are in need of childcare, babysitting is available during the day and evening. For information and reservations, please call The Greenbrier Concierge at 855-453-4858. Babysitters are background checked by the resort and average approximately \$13/hr. **Advance reservations are required.** The FDCC assumes no responsibility for the babysitting services.

The Greenbrier has something for everyone! Some activities have minimum participant requirements and may be cancelled or combined with another time slot if the minimum is not met. AERIAL ADVENTURE COMBO COURSE

Price: \$356 Duration: 3 hours Restrictions: 5 years and older; Maximum weight 300 lbs. Closed toe shoes required. Water provided.

The Greenbrier Adventure Course is designed for fun at all ages and skill levels. During this 3 hour experience, participants will navigate 12 challenges, all 45-50 feet in the air. These

challenges can be completed alone or in a group. Once each participant is harnessed up and clipped onto the course, the fun begins. At the end of the course participants will have the chance to exit by either a slow belayed descent or clipping into a free fall device for the ultimate rush.



BUBBLE SOCCER TOURNAMENT

Price: \$190 Duration: 2 hours
Restrictions: 14 years or older

What is more fun than trying to play soccer half-encased inside an inflated bubble? Playing bubble soccer with a bunch of your friends! It's hilarious! Grab a couple of friends and make a team. It's a round robin tournament for kids and adults alike!

Restriction: 10 years and older; Minimum weight 90 lbs. & maximum weight 265 lbs.

Buckle up for a Tree-Tops Canopy Zip Line Tour, and see the flora and fauna of the forest from a whole different viewpoint! The Canopy Tour takes you through 10 zips, 5 cable bridges, 1 rappel station, and overviews of Mill Creek. The Canopy Tour offers guests of all ages the opportunity to relax as they experience nature.

You will build your own charcuterie board and sample 3 different wines. The chefs will work with you to create "dimension" on the board and how to incorporate textures. At the end of the class, prior to enjoying the fruits of your labor, there will be an "Instagram ready" backdrop for you to photograph your creation! Guests will leave with their own West Virginia Cutting Board to use on their next charcuterie masterpiece!

E-BIKE RENTAL

Price: \$96 half day Duration: 2 hours

Restrictions: 5 years and older

Explore the hills and valleys of The Greenbrier's 11,000 acres on your own! An E-bike is an electric

bicycle with an integrated electric motor to assist the rider's pedal power.

ESCAPE ROOM

Price: \$30 per person per room. Duration: 1 hour

Restrictions: 10 years or older. 10-15 year olds must be accompanied by a paying adult

Rise to the challenge of the Greenbrier's Escape Room. The theme is constantly changing to keep the experience fresh, but the challenge is always exciting as you and your team follow clues, solve riddles and share information and ideas in order to solve a mystery and escape before your time runs out. Beat the fastest times and become a Greenbrier legend. The Greenbrier has 2 themed Escape Rooms: Titanic and Wizard of Oz.

FLY FISHING

Price: \$221 Duration: 2 hours Restrictions: 10 years or older for fly fishing. Younger kids can go spin fishing on Swan Lake.

Guests can fish Howard's Creek for spectacular catch and release fly fishing for trout or small mouth bass. Anglers of all levels can take pleasure in the views that the Allegheny Mountains have to offer.

GUN CLUB: SPORTING CLAYS

Price: \$107 Duration: 1.5 hours

Restrictions: Minimum age of 16 years

The Greenbrier welcomes all levels of enthusiasts! The Gun Club is located at Kate's Mountain and offers shooting amidst the picturesque Allegheny Mountains. Fees include shotgun, shells, hearing protection, safety glasses and shooting vest. There will be 25 clays per person.

HORSEBACK RIDING

The Greenbrier offers several "experience level" options for horseback riding, from flat land trails to adventures through the woods, all using English-style saddles. Due to the small number of riders allowed in each group, the FDCC encourages you to contact the hotel directly to schedule your ride. Call the hotel directly and ask for The Stables: 855-453-4858.



JEEP DRIVING ADVENTURE

Price: \$111 pp (3 ppl vehicle) Duration: 1 hour
 Restrictions: Minimum age to drive is 16 years old with a valid drivers license. Passenger minimum age is 8 years old, but affiliated driver must be at least 25 years old. Drivers under 18 years old must be accompanied by an adult. Height requirement: at least 4'9" and must be able to grasp handholds with feet on the floor and back fully against the backrest. Closed toe shoes required.

Get behind the wheel of a specially equipped Jeep Wrangler Rubicon and explore the mountains of West Virginia. The Greenbrier's highly trained Off Road Adventure guides will accompany and instruct up to three guests per vehicle on advanced driving techniques necessary to traverse The Greenbrier's private 11,000-acre mountain preserve. The terrain will vary from modest unpaved roads to some of the most extreme on the East Coast. The thirty-mile course has rocks, ruts, creek crossings, steep hills, gulleys and mud pits.

KAYAKING

Price: \$195 Duration: 2.5 hours
 Restrictions: 5 years and older

This guided paddling clinic is a great time for any age or skill level.

Create fun memories to last a lifetime! Until recently, traditional kayaks were best suited for

navigating ultra-challenging white water rapids. Today, a new breed of wider, more stable boats has made kayaking a sport that can be practiced by just about anyone. In this paddling clinic, you'll discover for yourself the thrills of recreational kayaking. Catch a glimpse of an osprey fishing for lunch or share a scenic view with a herd of deer foraging on the side of the river. Grab a friend and master the two-person kayak — or go solo and feel the speed of a sleek Perception Kayak.

MOUNTAIN BIKING

Price: \$126 Duration: 2 hours
 Restrictions: 5 years or older

Guided mountain bike tour of The Greenbrier River Trail.

MOUNTAINEER EXPERIENCE (ARCHERY, TOMAHAWKS & AIR RIFLE SHOOTING)

Price: \$195 Duration: 2 hours
 Restrictions: 10 years or older

Experience the feel of traditional archery with experienced instructors and permanent facilities. Customary equipment includes traditional re-curve bows and arrows. In addition to archery, try your skills with high powered pellet rifles. Participants will have the opportunity to shoot at a wide variety of kinetic pellet rifle targets. The range is designed to offer participants of all ages the chance to be successful. Guests will then learn the skill of tomahawk throwing. Under the



instruction of an experienced guide learn the proper technique to stick the Tomahawk in the wood target. Prior to entering the shooting range, participants will receive a safety briefing and introduction. Come test your ability at different range stations and varying targets, yardage and angles.

PADDLE BOARDING

Price: \$239 Duration: 2.5 hours

Restrictions: 5 years and older

This guided Stand Up Paddleboard adventure is a great time for any age or skill level. Spend the afternoon on The Greenbrier's gorgeous, local mountain lake learning the sport of Stand Up Paddle Boarding or SUP. SUPing is a growing sport among water lovers and boarding enthusiasts. What started in the Pacific Islands as a means of transportation has come to the mountains of West Virginia. Paddleboards are a wider, more stable version of an ocean surfboard that allow users to easily maneuver the board through the water using a longer version of a rafting paddle. The Greenbrier's paddle boarding adventures are designed for paddlers of all ages and skill levels, including first timers!

POLARIS RZR DRIVING ADVENTURE

Price: \$112/person (4 ppl per vehicle) Duration: 2 hours. Restrictions: Minimum age for drivers is 16 years with a valid drivers license and 12 years of age for passengers. Drivers must be at least 25 years old to drive minor passengers. Drivers under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult.

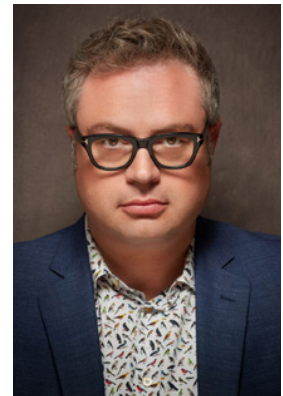

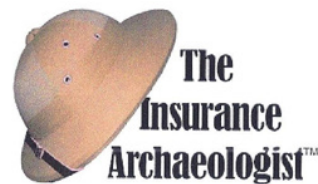
