Dear Federation Members and Families,

Welcome to sensational Seattle! We are excited to host our first Annual Meeting in an urban setting and prove yet again that Together We're Better. Although you'll enjoy the ease of flying directly into SEA-TAC International airport, only a few short minutes' drive from the hotel in the heart of downtown, you're also a walk or short drive away from world class hiking, water activities and all that makes the Pacific Northwest an ideal location for a summer getaway. It's a rare treasure to be able to enjoy all the excitement, fine dining and amenities of a top ranked city at the same time you experience the beauty of the lakes and mountains that surround you.

There is something for everyone in this summer's meeting. You'll experience the artwork of what is perhaps Seattle's most famous artist, learn a little about the history of the indigenous people of Seattle, and have a chance to check out the wide array of restaurants. You'll be hard pressed to find better seafood than in this harbor city and the array of ethnic restaurants is mind-blowing. There's a reason that Google, Amazon and Microsoft choose to have headquarters here. The city is vibrant and the weather in July cannot be beat.

The urban setting gives us a chance to break out of our standard routine and try a number of new things. This is reflected not only in our evening activities (our first disco), but also in the afternoon activities and in the afternoon activities. If you haven't tried something new this week, you aren't allowed to go home!



HOTEL INFORMATION

We will be enjoying the new, modern Hyatt Regency Seattle. Nestled in the heart of downtown, you are just a couple blocks away from some of Seattle's most notable locations: Pike Place Market, which houses the original Starbucks, the flagship Nordstrom, the monorail which drops you off right at the iconic Space Needle, Amazon's Seattle campus, and virtually unlimited fine dining.

The FDCC has negotiated a room rate of \$299 for a "run of house (ROH)" room. As we did with the Winter Meeting in Palm Springs, once you have registered, you will be sent a link so that you can reserve a room in our discounted room block. There is no additional resort fee. Please be aware that the hotel charges an incidental fee of \$75 per night which is refunded if not used throughout the course of your stay.

Our room rate is guaranteed until July 1, 2022 or until our roomblock is filled. We anticipate that the block will fill quickly, so we encourage you to make your room reservations promptly. You cannot book a room until after you have registered for the convention.

Check-in time is 4:00 pm and check-out is 11:00 am. In the event you arrive early or need to depart later, the valet will be happy to check your luggage at the hotel bell stand.

GETTING THERE

The Seattle-Tacoma International Airport is approximately 20 minutes from the Hyatt and provides non-stop service from most U.S. cities and services flights from all major airlines. We recommend that you utilize Ride Share services such as Uber or Lyft or taxis to get to the hotel from the airport (Ride Share fares are generally around \$35) If you choose to drive or rent a car, garage parking is available nearby but is not guaranteed. If you are in need of a rental car while you are attending the meeting (so much to explore!!), Sixt Car Rental has cars available from "our" Hyatt Regency. Check out their website: www.sixt.com to make advance reservations or for more information.

DRESS CODE AND WEATHER

The Pacific Northwest gets its beautiful greens and blues from the water, which pools in the lakes and rivers. And, while Seattle is known for the rain that fills these lakes, the summers are quite dry. President Bob Christie has guaranteed that there will be no rain during our meeting. Given that Seattle averages 3 days of rain in July, it seems like a pretty safe guarantee. Temperatures average a high of 75 and a low of 57 degrees. What a better way to escape the heat and the humidity than to spend a week with the FDCC!

For the meetings, we recommend business casual for all attendees at the meetings and education sessions. Seattle embraces the outdoors and attire is casual throughout the city. And Seattle is our resort. Few, if any, of the restaurants have a dress code. Feel free to wear your most comfortable shoes and cut loose a little. Bring an outer layer, not for rain bur for cool water breezes!

Recommended attire for the evening events and specific activities is identified with each event.

MEETING REGISTRATION

We invite you to register online to guarantee your selection of afternoon activities. Visit the FDCC website for the online link. You may also use the "hard copy" registration form which was included with this brochure or that can be downloaded from the FDCC website. Registrations that are mailed will be processed in the order that they are received, and selected activities may not be available. Registrations may also be faxed or scanned and emailed with credit card payment. Registrations cannot be processed without payment, including afternoon activities.

CHARM-THE SPACE NEEDLE

This year marks the 60th anniversary of the World's Fair which was held in Seattle. The unmistakable Space Needle which highlights the Seattle skyline was built specifically for the World's Fair. It seems only fitting that the charm for our meeting be a miniature version of this iconic structure.

CANCELLATION POLICIES

HOTEL CANCELLATIONS

All reservations are guaranteed with a deposit of the first night's reservation fee. Hotel cancellations received less than 14 days before arrival will forfeit the one-night deposit. The FDCC has no authority to modify the hotel's cancellation and refund policies.



CONVENTION REGISTRATION CANCELLATION DEADLINE

We realize that unforeseen emergencies and trial schedules may require cancellation. Please note the Board approved refund policy: A refund of registration fees, less \$85 and the applicable credit card fees charged to FDCC by the bank, will be given if the FDCC office receives written request of cancellation on or before June 24, 2022. After this date, no refunds will be given. In the event of special circumstances, such as illness or unforeseen family or professional emergencies, this refund policy may be suspended or modified, only by action of the President upon recommendation of the Convention Chair. It is recommended that all registrants get trip cancellation insurance. Fees paid for FDCC tours/activities are based on the tour operator's policies. The decision to refund those fees will be based on written notice of cancellation and the tour operator's refund policies.

FDCC ALCOHOL POLICY

The FDCC's policy is that alcohol shall be served at FDCC functions only to persons 21 years or older who are registered with the convention. FDCC members and guests who bring individuals to the Convention who are below the age of 21 will be expected to cooperate in the enforcement of this policy and to further assure that underage individuals abide by the policy.

CHILDREN & YOUTH ACTIVITIES

The FDCC will have special, age-appropriate programming for children during the Presidential Reception and the FDCC Disco events. Preregistration for those events is required and children must also be at least 5 years old and fully potty trained per Washington State laws regarding childcare.



EVENING ACTIVITIES

TUESDAY, JULY 26

PRESIDENT'S RECEPTION

We will be honoring our President and First Lady, Bob and Erin Christie on Tuesday night as we have exclusive run of the Chihuly Arts Garden. Dale Chihuly is guite possibly the most famous blown glass artist in the world, and he calls Seattle home. Chihuly draws extensively from nature in his work and the Chihuly Arts Garden is an exquisite mix of both Chihuly's works and nature at its finest. This is an adult only event (surprisingly small children and priceless glass art aren't exactly the same irresistible combination as Reese's chocolate and peanut butter.) Join us for cocktails and tour the museum before joining us for dinner in the Glass House at the base of the Space Needle. For those of you inspired by the artwork and want to try your own hand at glass blowing, we are offering an excursion to Seattle Blown Glass the next afternoon.

Cocktail attire or business casual attire. We will be making our way to the President's Reception via the monorail. The monorail is a 3 block walk from the hotel. In less than 4 minutes, the monorail will whisk you to the Chihuly Garden and Glass. The monorail is ADA compliant, but if you require alternate transportation, please indicate on your registration form.

While the President's Reception is for adults only, our younger family members will be entertained right next door at the Museum of Pop Culture "MoPop". www.mopop.org We will have child care and families will sign up with a particular child care provider who will be responsible for groups of 6-8 kids and will shepherd them through the museum and dinner. Families can ride the monorail together and reconvene to ride the monorail back to the hotel after.

The iconic Space Needle is also right next door to Chihuly. You may want to head over early and take a trip to the top of the 605-foot structure. Built for the World's Fair, since putting Seattle on the map in 1962, the Space Needle is a symbol of what is possible. This bird's eye view of Seattle is breathtaking. Allow at least 30 minutes if you wish to do this before the event. You may also purchase discounted tickets to the Space Needle through the registration process.

WEDNESDAY, JULY 27 DINNER WITH FRIENDS

Wednesday night you'll have the opportunity to try some of Seattle's finest restaurants on your own. Keep reading for insider tips! More than a dozen of our FDCC members are Seattlites, and they have identified their favorite dining spots. For those of you who prefer not to line up your own reservations, we will have a few reservations at local restaurants and sign-up opportunities at the registration desk for those of you who prefer a more traditional Dine Around experience. It's hard to find better seafood options than in Seattle, from salmon to oysters to Dungeness crab, you'll have myriad options for the fresh catch of the day. Additionally, Seattle enjoys a diverse population and many authentic ethnic restaurants from a variety of countries. Whether you are looking for white tablecloths or low-key family dining, Seattle has you covered.

But wait, there's more!

If you manage to save any room for dessert, and even if you don't manage to save room, please join us for the beloved FDCC Dessert Party. Stop by for a sweet treat and/or a night cap back at the hotel before calling it a day. The whole family is invited.

WEDNESDAY, JULY 27

CHATEAU STE. MICHELLE WINERY EXPERIENCE 1:00 PM - 4:30 PM COST: \$116.00

Washington state's oldest winery is located on 100 beautiful, wooded acres in Woodinville, an easy 45-minute ride from downtown Seattle. Chateau Ste. Michelle has earned some of the industry's highest accolades, including 22 "Winery of the Year" honors by Wine & Spirits, 18 "Top 100" Wines" by Wine Spectator, and numerous other state and national awards. Our group has secured exclusive use of the idyllic Sunken Garden for a guided tasting, and then enjoy the grounds with your Federation friends, including the tasting room, manor house, and wine shop.

GLASS BLOWING EXPERIENCE 12:15 PM - 4:00 PM COST: \$175.00

It would be hard to not be inspired by the exquisite blown glass work of Dale Chihuly on display during our President's reception. Here's your chance to learn how under the tutelage of

Pike Place Market is Seattle's original farmer's market. Perched above the waterfront and the giant Ferris Wheel that suspends you over the water, the Pike Place Market is home to dozens of eateries, crafts and retail stores including the original Starbucks. This may be the only place you can see fishmongers throwing fish and is right around the corner from Seattle's renowned "Gum Wall". The tour includes samples at various food stalls and a good dose of market history of this cultural hub of Seattle.

AFTERNOON ON THE WATER 12:30PM - 3:00 PM COST: VARIES BY ACTIVITY (SEE REGISTRATION FORM)

Just a few minutes away is beautiful Lake Union. Spend the afternoon on the water, either in an electric boat (seats 8), kayaking or paddle boarding. You will need to select which water activity you'd like ahead of time. Those who will be on an electric boat will take their box lunch with them on the boat. Those opting for kayaking, paddleboarding or hot tubbing will have the exclusive opportunity to enjoy their lunch at President Bob Christie's law office, right above the boat rental dock level. SEA PLANE TOUR OF SEATTLE 12:000 PM - 2:00 PM COST: \$170.00



Just 35 minutes from downtown is a mountain escape from the city. A box lunch will be provided for this a moderate hike which will take approximately two hours at a leisurely pace guided by Bob and Erin's daughter, Annie. This is not a remote alpine hike, in fact you are just in the foothills of the Cascade Range, but you will still be rewarded by gorgeous, deep, Douglas Fir forest and a rocky outcrop viewpoint at the top. Wear good walking shoes and bring water. 3.7 miles roundtrip, 1300 ft elevation gain. Great for school age kids!

FRIDAY, JULY 29

ARGOSY LOCKS CRUISE 12:00 PM - 3:00 PM COST: \$100.00

There is no better way to see Seattle than this two hour, fully-narrated tour, a one-way voyage from the Seattle waterfront through the calm waters of the inner harbor of Elliott Bay, traversing the Ballard Locks (the "boat elevator"), and then into Lake Union, where you'll be picked up for the short transfer back to the hotel. Along the way, guides will entertain and educate you about Seattle's history, neighborhoods, attractions, and maritime culture, while you're getting up close views of fishing vessels, seaplanes, and floating home communities, and unmatched views of Seattle's iconic skyline. The cruise is great for kids, and there's a full-service bar with snacks.

A short bus ride away is Alki Beach. You'll think you've been whisked away to a small northern California seaside town. Spend the afternoon on the beach playing frisbee or sand volleyball, visit any one of the many beachside restaurants, which offer everything from burgers, to fish and chips, to Mediterranean to Mexican fare. Go for a run along the shore, rent bikes or scooters or create your own happy hour. As part of this tour, you'll receive a FDCC Beach Towel to take home. We will also provide a few beach supplies, including an FDCC towel.

UNIVERSITY VILLAGE SHOPPING TOUR TIME: 12:00 PM - 3:30 PM COST: \$XX.XX

The Burke Gilman is an iconic trail through the Cityscape of Seattle and beyond. What used to be a railway corridor is now the premier option for nonmotorized transport across the city.
