Executive Summary

This report presents the findings of online research conducted from January 20 to January 30, 2022. The purpose of this research was to obtain a “snapshot” of Central District of California residents’ sentiment regarding life since March 2020 – the COVID-19 era.

Key findings in this research include:

- Eighteen percent of respondents reported a COVID-19 diagnosis and a relatively large proportion, 31%, reported someone close to them dying from COVID-19.
- While employment status has remained the same for most, nearly half report financial difficulties.
- Over 80% do not mind mask mandates.
- Seventy-eight percent of respondents would be willing to serve their jury service in the context of a “Zoom” meeting.
- Soliciting comment on the “Heroes,” “Villains,” and “Victims” of the pandemic, these data revealed:
 - Hero – hospitals, doctors, and nurses
 - Villain – former President Trump
 - Victim – the poor/low SES

Methodology

An online survey examined prospective jurors' sentiment in seven different counties in California, those that constitute the USDC, Central District of California. The survey was conducted over the course of eight days and involved a series of demographic questions including respondent county of residence, age, gender ethnicity, education, political affiliation, employment and household income. Respondents also answered a variety of questions regarding varied experiences with COVID-19 since March 2020. The survey focused on sentiment toward varied government and private entities and ended with open ended questions regarding perceptions of "Heroes," "Villains," and, "Victims." The final question asked respondent show they have adjusted to life during the pandemic.

This research was conducted using an opt-in, non-probability sampling method. There were 239 respondents from seven different counties who completed this survey.

Research Results

Respondents were instructed at the outset of the online survey the following:

We are conducting a survey regarding experiences and opinions as they relate to life since March 2020, the beginning of the COVID-19 Pandemic.

Do you commit to providing your thoughtful and honest answers to the questions in this survey, including a few, brief, open-ended questions at the end? There are no right or wrong answers. There are only opinions, and they are all important.






Diagnosed with COVID-19?


The preliminary questions focused on COVID-19 diagnoses, hospitalization, and how it has affected others close to the respondent. Eighteen percent (n = 43) of respondents in this survey reported that they have been diagnosed with COVID-19 since March 2020. Of these 43 respondents, eight (19%) were hospitalized.



Next, respondents were asked about family or friends who were hospitalized, and if anyone died as a result of COVID-19. These data revealed that many respondents know someone who was significantly affected, requiring hospitalization.




A very large proportion of respondent also reported someone “close” to them, family or friend, died due to COVID-19.




COVID-19 and “Life”

The next series of questions focused on respondents’ “Life” overall. That is, their employment, financial status, health/physical status, and mental health status since March 2020.


For employment, a firm majority of respondents reported that their employment status has stayed the same. Unfortunately, nearly 30% reported it has become worse.




Regarding financial status, a significantly large proportion reported that their financial status has become worse since March 2020.



Nearly two-thirds of respondents reported that their physical health status has stayed the same.




For mental health status a lesser proportion reported that their status has remained the same, while many more noted it has become worse relative to physical health status.



These data make clear that life is different and that the COVID-19 pandemic has certainly affected citizens, prospective jurors, in the United States.


And the Point is...?

Californians, and people in the United States are adapting. This is made clear in the written comments offered by respondents when asked about adaptation since March 2020. Respondents are adapting, coping, and getting by. Although not popular among many people, mask wearing is tolerated by most.



Of course, the courts have been impacted. Many venues are moving to, at least in part, having court proceeding in a virtual format. The courts are learning to adapt and use technology to its benefit in many venues. While we all hope for life to return to what was “normal” in terms of pre-COVID-19, using technology for at least some portions of court proceedings is inevitable. We should be ready for this paradigm shift in proceedings and position ourselves to embrace technology and best use it.

Would Californians be willing to adapt to these potential changes? Well, we asked them:



These data revealed that 78% of California residents within the Central District of California would be willing to serve as jurors in the context of a “Zoom” meeting.


Pandemic Players

Respondents were asked about their opinions regarding the actions or performance by the parties below relative to the Pandemic.

The players that are part of daily life, the pharmacy, bank, and grocery store frequented by respondents all received favorable ratings by large proportions of respondents, from 73% to 80%.

A few “forefront” companies, including pharmaceutical companies Pfizer and Johnson & Johnson, Amazon, and Disneyland were mixed, but Amazon was viewed very favorably.

Government and varied leaders were viewed the least favorable by respondents in this survey, led by former President Trump, President Biden, and Governor Newsom. Many respondents did not view “the media” favorably.



Heroes, Villains, and Victims

Respondents were next asked, in an open-ended format, who they thought were heroes, villains, and victims these past two years. First, the “Heroes,” which may be seen in appendix A. Respondents were asked:

In just a word or two, who (person or persons) or what (organization) do you believe has done well during the Pandemic? In other words, a “**hero**”?

HEROES

For **Heroes**, the entities that were provided were varied between organizations, companies, and varied people, as well as an amalgam of people – “politicians.” The most frequent groups noted, top five, were:

1. Hospitals, healthcare, doctors, and nurses
2. Varied Politicians (Gov. Newsom, Alexandria Ocasio Cortez, Bernie Sanders, “Republicans,” Ron Desantis)
3. Frontline workers (police, fire, ambulance)
4. Pharmaceutical Industry (Pfizer, J&J, Moderna, “Pharma”)
5. Dr. Anthony Fauci

Reference to hospitals, healthcare, doctors, and nurses was *by far* the most frequent with over 60 separate comments.

VILLAINS

Next are the “Villains” of the pandemic, where respondents were asked:

In just a word or two, who (person or persons) or what (organization) do you believe has done poorly during the Pandemic? Perhaps a “**villain**”?

The varied categories for “Villains” were less homogeneous than “Heroes” and focused most often on government, politicians, and especially former President Trump:

1. “Trump”
2. Government
3. Politicians (Newsom, “congress”)
4. Biden
5. Anti-vaxxers/Deniers/Anti-mask

VICTIMS

A large proportion of the comments provided for “Victims” highlighted the broad category of “all of us,” “the community,” “everyone,” etc. This was the second most frequent theme. Focusing on specific groups, there were five that were distinct and frequent topics presented in the media:

1. The poor, lower SES, homeless
2. Small business and restaurants
3. Medical personnel and medical facilities
4. Children and schools
5. The elderly, senior citizens

Adjusting to Life During the Pandemic

The quantitative data gathered in this research are important and provide insight regarding respondents' views on how they have adjusted to life during the Pandemic.

All 239 verbatim comments were reviewed, analyzed, categorized, and are sorted into two groups, "Copers" and "Quitters," and then by age, gender, and race. The verbatim comments may be seen in appendix A. Those identified as "Copers" are respondents who, while acknowledging challenges and difficulty, highlight what they have done the past two years to deal with the COVID-19 era, how they have coped. Respondents categorized as "Quitters" provided generally pessimistic commentary with an overall sense of despair and inability to deal with the COVID-19 era.

There were seven categories that emerged during the editing, review and analysis of these data. There was a small number of comments not classified due to vagueness or making reference to nothing of substance.

Among the "Copers" the most frequent, though sometimes circular comment, is that they have adapted or changed their lives to deal with the varied challenges, "hassles," and problems these past few years. They are trying their best. Although many comments highlight strain and difficulty, overall they do not voice failure or giving up. Several examples include:

- For the most part decently, but there is still a lot I need to work on.
- I've become more reliant on technology by using Zoom meetings for classes and using the Internet to communicate with friend via social media and messaging applications like Discord and Telegram.
- There hasn't been too many adjustments. I just have been using hand sanitizer and wiping down surfaces more.
- It has definitely made life harder, but I manage.
- I think I have adjusted well to life during the pandemic. I have tried to be safe.

Other comments were more specific with respect to what respondents did in their daily lives, notably mask wearing and compliance with government rules and mandates:

- Wearing a mask doesn't bother me at all. I'm more precautions when going out but to an extent.

- Wearing a mask.
- I accept the different rules, guidelines, and mandates that my county has implemented. I don't see it as offensive or obstructive to my daily life.
- Comply with all requirements however ridiculous.
- I believe that I have adjusted to life during the pandemic by following all rules that the government provided.

There were several optimistic and upbeat comments offered by some respondents that highlighted generally maintaining a positive attitude. Several examples include:

- I adapted very quickly. My mindset was "LET'S DO THIS!"
- Stay home more. Thankful for a backyard. Try to be more charitable at church. Thankful.
- I cook at home more and eat healthier. I'm happier because I've lost weight.
- I adjusted quite well. I control the things within my might, and don't worry about the rest.

Among the "Copers" were two additional categories, both very different from one another, that received few comments, **religion** and **general disregard** for the Pandemic, but are provided here:

- I've made no changes. I'm not part of the COVID cult. I ignore gaslighting.
- I have adjusted by the grace of God & nobody else.
- My Lord keeps me going and friends and family support.

Next are the comments offered by the "Quitters." This group was divided into only two categories, including the element of simply not adjusted or not doing well and what was categorized as a complaining or dismissive sentiment. First are several examples of comments suggesting respondents have been unable to adjust to life during the COVID-19 era:

- I will never adjust to life during the pandemic.
- Not well. I stayed inside most of the time.
- I haven't. Every day is a struggle.
- I haven't. In my neighborhood people still throw house parties and don't wear masks and have died. This is making me extremely anxious and afraid to leave the house for long periods of time. I just don't want to leave the house but also because the crime in California is out of control.

Finally, among the "Quitters" were comments, fewer, that were essentially dismissive of COVID-19 or had a sense of complaining:

- It has been hard on everyone. The current administration has done a terrible job and has caused untrust in government. What was right is not wrong and what is wrong is right in this country. Bad is good and good is bad. Criminals are exempt for their actions. This country is destroying our constitution.
- Just my opinion. I don't believe in the pandemic. The government has something plan for the world.
- I have not been able to believe or trust anything that I see or hear from the mainstream media.
