We are excited to offer loads of budget friendly, family fun!



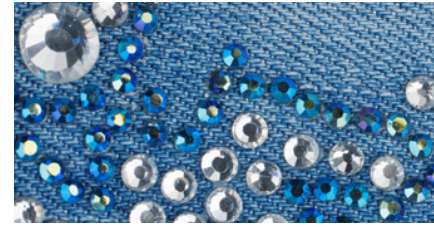
*"Colorado is for kids!"*

# Do More at The Broadmoor!

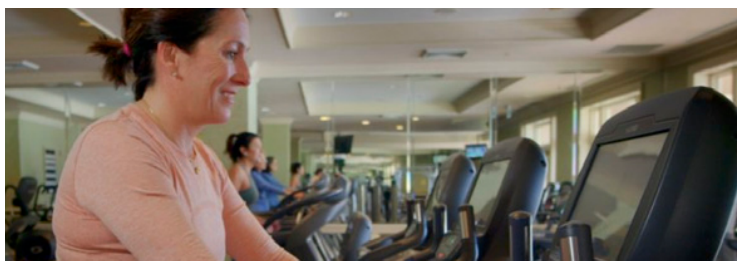
**Bicycles** Mountain bikes, fat-tire, and hybrid bikes are available for rent to explore the neighborhoods or trails surrounding The Broadmoor.



**Bowling Alley/Game Room** Come play at PLaY. With six lanes and a game room, plus bar food, you'll have a ball. **Reservations** are required for bowling, and separate reservations are required for dining.



**Broadmoor Golf Club** With two championship golf courses to challenge you, oh the stories you'll tell. The East Course, originally designed by Donald Ross in 1917, is one of twelve North American and Caribbean golf courses to receive a five-star rating by Golf Digest. The Course has hosted many tournaments, such as the 1959 U.S. Amateur Open (Jack Nicklaus' first win), the 1995 U.S. Women's Open (Annika Sorenstam's first major title), and the 2018 U.S. Senior Open. In 2025, The Broadmoor will host the U.S. Senior Open. The West Course will challenge you with more doglegs and steeply angled greens than the East Course. Home to many PGA Cup Matches, come and see how your game matches up.



**Fitness Center** Open daily from 5:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., the fitness center is free of charge and open to hotel guests. From weights to treadmills to fitness classes, you can find whatever you are looking for to work off last night's dinner.

The FDCC has negotiated a room rate of \$375 per night, plus 10.20% tax and 2.95% public improvement fee, for a “run of house” [room](#). There is also a [daily resort charge](#) of \$39 per room, plus tax. Check-in time is after 4:00pm, and check-out time is 12:00pm. In the event you arrive early or need to depart later, the valet will be happy to check your luggage at the hotel bell stand.

The Broadmoor offers overnight valet parking for hotel guests for \$35 per night, or overnight self-parking is available in the hotel's garage for \$25 per night with full in and out privileges.

**Currently, our room block at The Broadmoor is sold out.** There are two important things you should know if you do not already have a room at The Broadmoor. First, other rooms may open up. While we cannot make any guarantees, another convention at the hotel is not filling its room block and it may return rooms to the hotel. If that happens, The Broadmoor will offer rooms to our members. ## Child Care

The FDCC will have special, age-appropriate programming for teens and children during the Presidential Reception on Monday night and during the Diamonds and Denim Gala on Thursday night. **Pre-registration is required.** Children must be at least 3 years old and fully potty trained to participate.

Teens and children of all ages are encouraged to attend the Sunday Welcome Reception, the Tuesday Midway theme party, and the Wednesday Zoo and Dessert Party events.

If you desire child care at any other time during the convention, The Broadmoor offers the Bee Bunch Camp for children age 3 to 12, with age-appropriate activities that include outdoor lessons, arts and crafts, STEAM activities, nature walks, field trips, and more. Half-day and full-day options are available. Sitters can also be arranged for days or evenings through Broadmoor Nannies. ## Meeting Registration

The early bird conference registration rate is \$1,995 for Defense Counsel members and \$850 for guests. Early bird registration ends on June 9, 2023. After that date, the rate is \$2,145 for Defense Counsel members and \$850 for guests.

Corporate and Industry members rate - \$695 and \$850 for guests

Emeritus Members and their guests rate - \$800.

The registration rates for children are tiered based upon age. Children 3 and under are complimentary. Children 4 to 11 are \$260, children 12 - 17 are \$425, and children 18-20 are \$650.

**We urge you to register online promptly to guarantee your selection of afternoon activities.** Visit the FDCC website for the online link. You may also use the "hard copy" registration form which was included with this brochure or that can be downloaded from the FDCC website. Registrations that are mailed will be processed in the order that they are received, and selected activities may not be available.

Registrations may also be faxed or scanned and emailed with credit card payment. **Registrations cannot be processed without payment, including afternoon activities.**

### Convention Registration Cancellation Deadline

A refund, less applicable credit card charges, will be granted if the notice of cancellation is received by the Executive Director before June 23, 2023.

A refund of all registration fees, less \$250.00, will be made if the notice of cancellation is received by the Executive Director on or after June 23, 2023, but before July 13, 2023.

A refund of all registration fees less \$500.00 will be made if the notice of cancellation is received by the Executive Director on or after July 13, 2023.

Activity charges may be refunded if the Vendor refunds fees or if another member fills the spot vacated by the cancellation.

# Be Aware and Be Prepared

## Getting there

The Broadmoor is easily accessible from both Colorado Springs Airport (COS) and from Denver International Airport (DEN). COS is approximately 15 minutes from The Broadmoor, DEN is approximately 90 minutes from The Broadmoor. One-way or round-trip transportation services are available from either COS or DEN to The Broadmoor through Gray Line Transportation ([www.broadmoor.com/grayline](http://www.broadmoor.com/grayline)) or by calling (855) 266-2522. Reservations are required at least 48 hours in advance. If traveling from and to DEN, however, a rental car is recommended.



## Dress Code and Weather

With daytime temperatures in the 80's and nighttime temperatures around 60 degrees, there is no better time to visit Colorado Springs than [July!](#)

Overall, The Broadmoor is a relaxed resort. Recreation wear and casual dress are the general standard for the [dress code](#).

For meetings and education sessions, we recommend business casual attire for attendees. Recommended attire for the evening events and specific activities is identified with each event. You will want to make sure to pack cocktail attire - preferably in purple, green, or gold - (and a wrap to keep you warm in the cool night air) for the Mardi Gras President's Reception. For the final night's Gala, you will want to bring your best denim and dress it up with lots of diamonds and sparkle.

## Elevation

The elevation of The Broadmoor, at more than 6,200 feet above sea level, can affect new arrivals. Take it easy, and remember to stay well hydrated!

### FDCC FedNOW App

### Charm - Bumblebee

The Bumblebee found its place in the history of The Broadmoor when the Chairman of the hotel purchased and re-assembled the contents of an 1800s English pub at The Broadmoor, naming it The Golden Bee. The Golden Bee continues to delight its customers today, as the lively wait staff is known for throwing embroidered bumblebee stickers across the room and sticking them to customer's clothes. 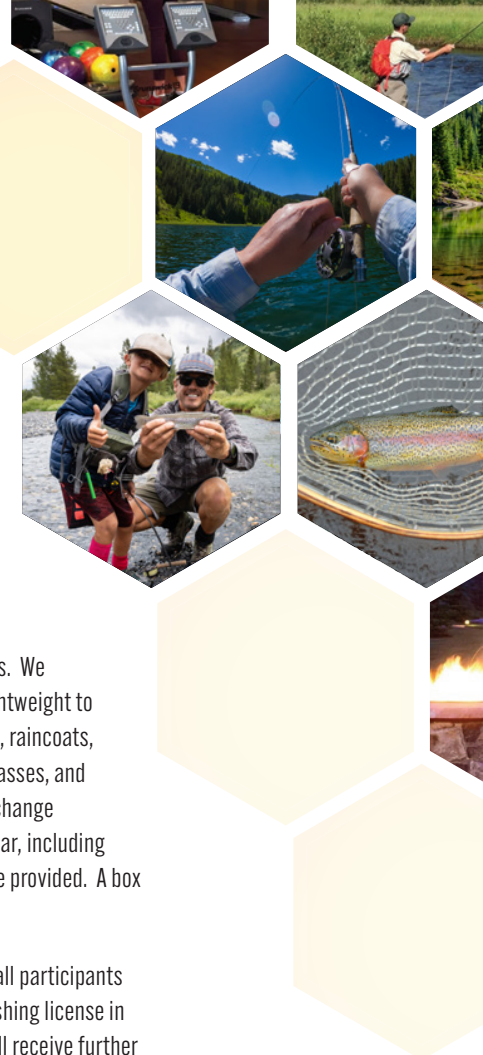

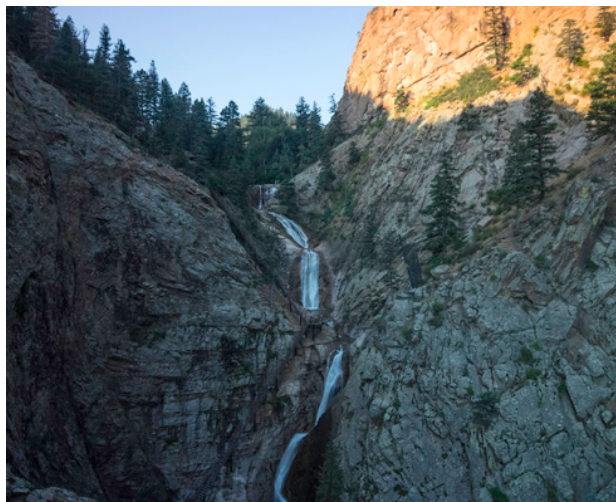

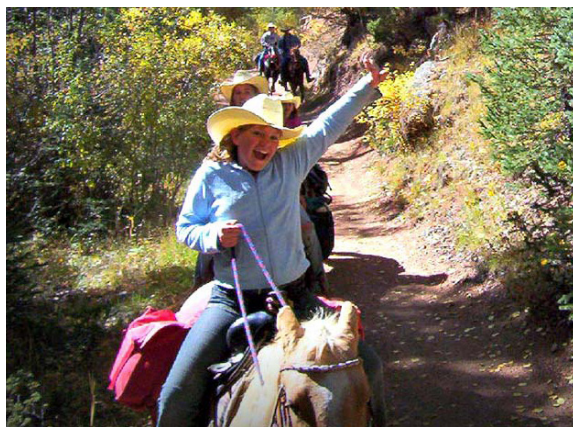

Seven Falls is situated in a 1,250-foot wall box canyon between the towering Pillars of Hercules. Take in stunning valleys, striking rock formations and golden prairies as you climb the challenging 224 steps to the hiking trails and the banks of glistening streams that feed the falls, and Seven Falls' 181-foot drop of falling water.

Closed toe shoes are recommended. The park is stroller and wheelchair accessible, but please note that there is an approximate 100-yard transition from the drop off point of the tram to the base

of the falls, and it is approximately a 30-yard transition from the drop off point of the tram to the Mountain Elevator, which will take you to the Eagle's Nest platform with beautiful panoramic views of the falls. However, the elevator only takes you so far. The top of the falls is only accessible via the 224 steps up the Main Falls Staircase.

This year is the railway's 130th anniversary. The Cog Railway departs Manitou Springs at 6,320 feet and will reach the top of Pikes Peak at 14,115 feet. The scenic trip takes one hour and ten minutes each way, and we will spend about forty minutes exploring at the summit. All aboard for this accessible and picturesque ride to the top of the world.

Because of the high altitude, this excursion is not recommended for anyone with a history of cardiac or respiratory problems. Lightheadedness and disorientation can occur at this elevation, and people with existing health issues and people who cannot communicate their symptoms should proceed with caution. Good hydration is paramount to avoid the effects of high altitude, so be sure to drink lots of water! Please also note the railway does not allow strollers due to space, and be sure to dress in layers as the temperature will decrease with increased elevation. A box lunch is included with this excursion.

1:00pm - 4:00pm [Horseback Riding](#) Cost: \$190.00

Go back in time to when the west was wild. At Old Stage Riding Stables, you will have a guided tour through the path used by stagecoaches years ago that connected Colorado Springs with the historic mining town of Cripple Creek. Whether you love to ride horses or want to be more like a character of Yellowstone, this is your chance. This excursion will offer a beautiful 90-minute riding experience that escorts you through trails with mountain views, and the chance to spot over 100 varieties of wildflowers, and possibly some forest fauna. Mule deer, elk, Abert squirrels, and other indigenous animals are not an uncommon sight. You will also learn about the local historic areas along the way.

You should wear closed toe shoes, some comfortable pants and a shirt that is not overly restrictive. The minimum age to ride is 8 years old, and maximum weight is 200 lbs.

Tour the Garden of the Gods on a mountain bike. See the pink, red and white sandstone "fins" formed millions of years ago when the Rocky Mountains and Pikes Peak were formed. The ride tours the Garden of the Gods along paved bike paths and gentle singletrack trails. If mountain biking is your thing, this excursion is a must for you.

Wear recreational gear that is comfortable for cycling. You will be provided with a specialized mountain bike, helmet, reflective safety wear vests, and water. Children must be at least 4'10" to ride, and all guests must be under 250 pounds to ride.

Your Wild West Experience begins with a ride up Old Stage Road, the stage-coach route used by those making their way to the gold-mining communities of Victor and Cripple Creek. Once off the Stage Road, you will find yourself in the forested canyon floor of South Cheyenne Creek, where Ponderosa Pine and Douglas Fir whisper in the breeze and the creek flows toward Seven Falls Park, far below in

the canyon. This hidden canyon is where you will learn and hone the skills once necessary to survive in the Wild West!

Standing archery targets offer a chance to perfect your aim before you head through the forest to a walking range where 3-D targets of critters and varmints will be waiting for you. Once you've made your way through the archery range, you will exchange your bow and arrow for tomahawks. You will be shown the proper technique for tomahawk throwing and will have the opportunity to throw at three hanging targets made from thick slices of local timber. After you have stuck your tomahawks, you will head to the pellet gun range.

Comfortable, recreational clothing is recommended. Participants must be a minimum of 5-years old to participate. Safety glasses, equipment, and water will be provided. (Please take note - the Wild West Experience is part of the Kid's Adventure night on Thursday for kids ages 12 - 17.)

## [Bear Creek Nature Center](#)

Hike the foothills, search for mule deer, and discover Bear Creek. Scrub oak thicket, ponderosa pine forests, meadows, a mountain creek, and abundant foothills wildlife attract children and adults to Bear Creek Regional Park and Nature Center. Interpretive programs, special events, guided and self-guided tours, and media presentations are offered all year. Outside, two miles of self-guided nature trails wind through the short grass prairie, scrub oak woodlands, and cottonwood riparian communities. The nature trails are for foot traffic only, but the regional trails are open to hiking and horseback riding.

## [The Broadmoor Manitou and Pikes Peak Cog Railway](#)

The Cog has been climbing Pikes Peak since 1891 and is one of the most unique experiences in the country. Recognized as the world's highest cog railroad, the railway is an important part of the heritage of the Western United States. Taking this journey is like walking in the footsteps of history, and now the adventure is even more iconic and inspiring.

Come walk with one of the experienced and knowledgeable guides as you get up-close views of the beautiful, majestic, and elusive animals housed at the Center.

### Dinosaur Resource Center

The Dinosaur Resource Center offers a variety of museum related services, including fossil mounting, molding, and casting, 3D scanning and printing, traveling exhibits, and more. The museum offers over 30 specimens and a number of hands-on exhibits where you can learn about the latest dinosaur information from the people who actually go out and find the fossils!

### Downtown Colorado Springs

### Garden of the Gods

The towering red rock formations of the Garden of the Gods Park come alive when you visit the free Visitor and Nature Center and explore the geology, plants, animals, and people of this amazing 1,341.3-acre regional park. It offers towering sandstone formations, wonderful views of Pikes Peak, paved and unpaved hiking paths, the historic Rock Ledge Ranch Historic Site, a living history museum, and many other amenities.



### Manitou Cliff Dwellings

The Manitou Cliff Dwellings are comprised of Ancestral Puebloan ruins that date back 800 to 1000 years old. Explore the fascinating architecture of the ancient cliff dwellers and browse through two museums featuring cultural displays all overlooking the historic town of Manitou Springs. You can even walk around and through the rooms



of the cliff dwellings, and visitors who are slender and short enough can actually slip into some of the smaller rooms to get a feel for Ancestral Puebloan apartment house living. The magic and mystery of the Native American culture is sure to delight visitors of all ages.

### Manitou Springs

Nestled between Garden of the Gods and Pikes Peak, historic Manitou Springs is the perfect place to spread out in the great outdoors and then find a cozy sport to settle in with your friends or family. From mild to wild, world-renowned trails are just waiting to be explored in Manitou. If you are up to the challenge, the 2,744 steps of elevation at the Manitou Incline await your arrival. If you need to rejuvenate after such a strenuous climb, you can take a sip from the healing waters of one of the many natural mineral springs in the area and then pay a visit to one of the over 30 locally owned restaurants for well-earned sustenance.



### Old Colorado

#### City

With over 100 unique businesses, take a stroll in Old Colorado City and enjoy shopping, fine dining, sidewalk and patio cafes, boutiques, galleries, jewelry, and a variety of seasonal events and activities, antiques, sweets and treats, and more! Old Colorado City is the perfect blend of small town charm, historic character, and all the good times and excitement of a top destination.

### Penrose Heritage Museum

Penrose Heritage Museum showcases the history and heritage of the Pikes Peak region through the personal artifact collection of Colorado Springs' philanthropists Spencer and Julie Penrose. The Penrose Heritage Museum exhibits 30 carriages, personal artifacts of Spencer and Julie Penrose, and 15 race cars that competed in the infamous Race to the Clouds, one of the oldest motorsport events in the U.S., second only to the Indianapolis 500.

### Peterson Air and Space Museum

The Edward J. Peterson Air and Space Museum seeks to preserve and portray the rich aviation and space history of Colorado Springs and Peterson Space Force Base. From barnstorming beginnings to our modern space era, come see the exhibits that will educate and inspire.



### Pikes Peak - America's Mountain

Pikes Peak is one of Colorado's most majestic mountains, but it is fully accessible to people of all ages and abilities. The safe and scenic Pikes Peak Highway provides you the opportunity to enjoy 19 miles of mountain terrain, with frequent pull-offs for you to get out, stretch your legs, and take photos or enjoy one of the many picnic areas and hiking trails. On the clearest days, at the summit, you can see five states (Colorado, Arizona, New Mexico, Utah, and Kansas) and even the curvature of the earth fading into the distance.

### Play Street Children's Museum

Your kids will have a blast exploring the Great Outdoors through the museum's interactive exhibits and educational play space. Kid-themed activities can pretend and imagine endless adventures in the museum's tree house and campsite. Adults are welcome to join in the fun or sit back and relax while their children discover a world that is just their size in this interactive children's museum.

### ProRodeo Hall of Fame

The ProRodeo Hall of Fame and Museum of the American Cowboy educates the public about rodeo, its history and impact on Western American culture, and provides recognition to rodeo notables of the past and present and serves as an inspiration for the future.

You can cover the gorge on a family friendly, guided climbing experience through the Via Ferrata course, where you will experience views of the bridge and get perspectives of the gorge's depths that you can't find anywhere else. Fly by the seat of your pants across the Royal Gorge, rim to rim on the Cloudscraper Zip Line, or you can also swing up to 50 mph over the edge of the Royal Gorge on the World's Scariest Skycoaster, which swings harnessed riders 1,200-feet over the Arkansas River.



### Space Foundation Discovery Center
